The proclamation from the City Council will be presented on Friday, June 25 at the Seven Deadly Sins Gala kicking off Pride weekend at the W Hotel. The mayoral proclamation will be presented Sunday, June 27 on the Pride Street Fair stage located on Bourbon between Orleans and St. Ann Streets.

The Gay Lesbian Bisexual Transgender Community of New Orleans celebrates thirty-one years of Pride Wednesday-Sunday, June 23-27. The all new NOLA Pride Committee has worked diligently this year in *Bringing Pride Back to New Orleans* and restoring trust in New Orleans Pride organization. It joins InterPride (International Association of LGBT Pride Organizers) in celebration of the 2010 theme of *One Heart, One World, One Pride*.

Early on the committee asked various respected community leaders to be on the Honorary Presenting Committee to lend credibility to the event. Sunday, June 27 closes out the weekend with two big events. The first is the Pride 2nd Line Parade. The walking parade will be led by the New Orleans Rainbow 2nd Line Band under the direction of Kent Richard, followed by one carriage with Pride Grand Marshals Steven Forster and Cathy Fox, and Mr. and Miss Gay Pride Travis Bergeron and Tami Tarmac on board, then by all registered walking groups. The parade starts promptly at 1pm. Line-up is St. Louis between Dauphine and Burgundy from 12noon-12:45pm. Check in at The Double Play, 439 Dauphine, with Lineup Chair Steve Patrick. Position in parade is determined by when Entry Form and payment were received. The parade turns right on Burgundy, right on St. Ann, left on Bourbon ending at Dumaine.

New Orleans first Pride Street Fair runs 12noon-6pm with loads of entertainment.

Of my next treatment regimen: KALETRA once a day with my other HIV medicines.

KALETRA once daily should not be given to children. KALETRA once daily should not be taken with efavirenz (Atripla® and Sustiva®), nevirapine (Viramune®), amprenavir (Agenerase®), nelfinavir (Viracept®), carbamazepine (Tegretol® and Epitol®), phenobarbital (Luminol®), or phenytoin (Dilantin®). Use

KALETRA® is a prescription anti-HIV-1 medicine called a protease inhibitor that contains lopinavir and ritonavir. KALETRA is used with other anti-HIV-1 medicines to increase the chance of treatment response in people with human immunodeficiency virus (HIV-1) infection. It is not known if KALETRA is safe and effective in children under 14 days old.

KALETRA does not cure HIV-1 infection or AIDS and does not reduce the risk of passing HIV-1 to others. People taking KALETRA may still get opportunistic infections or other conditions that happen with HIV-1.

KALETRA Safety Considerations

Do not take KALETRA® if you are allergic to any of its ingredients, including lopinavir or ritonavir. Do not take KALETRA with certain medicines, as they can cause serious problems, death, or make KALETRA less effective against HIV. Some patients taking KALETRA can develop inflammation of the pancreas and liver problems, which can cause death. Patients may develop changes in heart rhythm, large increases in triglycerides and cholesterol, diabetes, high blood sugar, changes in body fat, and/or increased bleeding in people with hemophilia. Some patients may develop signs and symptoms of serious infections they already have after starting anti-HIV medicines.
