Giant GAA banners welcomed them outside of Oz in New Orleans created by the innovative and talented Doyle Yeager and partner Keith Trammell. Doyle, who is one of the proprietors of Oz, also did a magnificent job on transforming the club into a venue worthy of an Academy Awards party. From the brilliant red, gold and star studded stage, to the VIP tables, each with their own platter full of sugared pecans, grapes, strawberries, and gourmet mixed nuts, centered with fresh rose arrangements, it was indeed spectacular.


